Because students often post detailed and specific information on Facebook (including phone numbers, addresses, class schedules, social plans, etc.) you can be more easily stalked by strangers (or even acquaintances).

Did you know?

Identity theft can also be a significant risk of social networking. Personal details like your full name, names of your family members, your phone number, birthday, address, and place of employment can all be used by identity thieves.

Inappropriate posts on social media can have severe repercussions on a student's academic career, and students can lose jobs, internships and even interviews because of the information potential employers are finding out about students on their social networking accounts.

Underground App

HiCalculator: The app's description indicates it "can hide your photos and videos behind a calculator." Parents, teachers and other adults are likely to pass over the app without realizing it.



Undergroundd App

Whisper: The app states Users must be 17 years old to download the app. Even if children followed that age restriction, high school students can download and use it. The app lets users share their thoughts or opinions via text that is placed on top of an image. Users also can connect directly with one another. It has the potential for cyberbullying and online harassment.



Underground App

ASKfm: This app lets users ask anonymous questions (they also can choose to not be anonymous). Kids might use it for cyber bullying and to unfairly target certain classmates.



Underground App

Hide It Pro: Users can hide pictures and videos behind a lock screen and can create multiple photo and video albums and email them to others from inside the app. The app automatically locks when users exit it, and it also includes a code-enabled feature that makes the app appear empty if someone, like a parent or teacher, finds it and knows what it does.



Evernote

The app is a great tool for students who need assistance with their executive functioning skills. Included within the app is the ability to make separate notebooks and tag notes for easy access, helping kids with organizational and planning issues. Kids can make separate notebooks for each subject area, and the notebooks are simple with a clean interface for kids who can be easily distracted.



Remind 101

Remind is a free text messaging app that helps teachers, students, and parents communicate quickly and efficiently.



Quizlet

Quizlet.com is a free website which enables teachers and students to create digital flash cards. It can automatically generate interactive games and even tests of the material you enter into it.
